

⇒ Ken is <u>a little [slightly]</u> taller than his brother (is). 「ケンは兄よりもわずかに背が高い。」

優劣の差を具体的に示す場合

Ken is taller than his brother (is).

= Ken is taller than his brother (is) $\underline{by 20 \text{ cm}}$.

Riko can no more read Haruki Murakami's books than eat bugs.

= Riko can<u>not</u> read Haruki Murakami's books <u>any more than</u> eat bugs.



最上級とは

最上級 = 原則、〔3人以上〕または〔3つ以上〕の中で、 〔一番優れている〕または〔一番劣っている〕ことを表す。

最上級は<u>一番程度が高い</u>ことを表現するが、世界中で一番になる のは非現実的なケースが多い。故に<u>最上級の範囲を限定</u>して、そ の中で一番であると述べる方が現実的だ。その最上級の範囲を限 定するときに用いる前置詞が "in" や"of" である。

<in + 集団・場所> e.g. in the class, in Japan

<of + 同類の人や物> e.g. of all the students, of all the boys, of all the books, of all

形容詞の最上級(1)

My dad handed me the most amazing gift for my birthday.

形容詞の最上級(2)

口語では〔be動詞やseemの直後〕または〔知覚動詞の直後〕の"the"は省略されることが多い。ただし形容詞の最上級の直後に名詞が来る場合は、省略不可。

When you are hungry, snickers is (the) best.

Which cigarette tastes (the) best to you?

This website looks (the) most useful for my project.

副詞の最上級

the + [副詞の最上級] 「最も〔副詞〕」 副詞の最上級の "the"は省略されることが多いが、<in + 集団・場所> <of + 同類の人や物>がうしろに続く場合は "the"をつける必要がある。

Nanaka runs (the) fastest.

「ナナカは最も速く走る。」

Nanaka runs the fastest in the class.「ナナカはクラスで最も速く走る。」

Nanaka runs the fastest of all the students.

「ナナカは全生徒の中で最も速く走る。」

Orangutans are thought to be most closely related to humans.

最上級+that節

最上級のうしろにthat節をおくことで、比較する範囲を限定できる。(このthatは関係代名詞)

She is the kindest person (that) I've ever met.

最上級の強調

Matt Damon is by far the sexiest actor of all.

Christine is <u>much</u> the best person for the job.

最上級に **"the"**がつかないケース

The swimming pool is deepest in the center.

 \Leftrightarrow The swimming pool is (the) deepest in this town.

「そのプールはこの町で最も深い。」

My mother is nicest on her birthday.

「母は誕生日に最も優しくなる。」

 \Leftrightarrow My mother is the nicest woman in this town.

at least 「少なくとも」(考えられうる最小の数字や量を述べるときに用いられる。)

It will save you <u>at least</u> \$2 per day to drink water instead of beer at dinner.

最上級の重要表現(2)

at best 「よくても」(最も楽観的な見方をすると(をしても)) Those who don't believe in themselves are pets <u>at best</u>.

at worst 「悪くても」(最も悲観的な見方をすると(をしても)) Loss of electricity in our homes, businesses, schools, and hospitals is inconvenient <u>at best</u>—and life-threatening <u>at worst</u>.

make the most of ... ≒ make the best of ...「...を最大限利用する」

ISIS has <u>made the most of</u> social media and recruited over 27,000 foreign fighters.
